Emergency Plan

Maintaining an emergency plan for potential invasion is critical for Canadians. It's recommended that Canadians have enough supplies for 7 to 14 days.



Emergency Kit

The Canadian Red Cross recommends that civilians have an emergency kit available during any national event, like a Russian invasion.



Emergency Alerts

The Canadian Broadcast System is connected to all smartphones nationwide. As such, civilians can connect their devices to the emergency alert service.



Evacuation Route

Maintaining an evacuation route is essential during a Russian invasion.



Stay Informed

Staying informed and knowing the latest news is essential. Any headlines suggesting the possibility of a Russian invasion should be taken seriously. However, that information should come from reliable sources like CTV News or the Canadian Government.



Stay Connected

Under the pretense that Russia invaded Canada, staying connected with family & friends is essential.



Government Documents

Canadians should have their birth certificates, passports, and insurance policies in safekeeping during their evacuation route.



Follow Government Instructions

Once government officials have convened and discussed the next steps for Canadians, the Canadian Broadcast System will follow with instructions.



Be Mindful of Social Media

It's recommended that Canadians avoid listening to news reports on social media unless from verified government sources.



Stay Calm

Finally, the best thing Canadians can do during an invasion is remain calm. Don't allow emotions to overrule your judgment, as straightforward & direct thinking is needed during these moments.
